HEALTH AND WELL-BEING

- This year we saw great emotional and personal growth in each one of our boys as they continued to receive individual and group psychology lessons, helping them break down past barriers of abuse and abandonment.
- On a monthly basis, the boys share their many blessings with the needy in Mexico. They visit the elderly, feed the homeless, and sing Christmas carols in order to perform acts of mercy and help the less fortunate.
- We were so happy to celebrate the 20th anniversary of St. Innocent Orphanage this year, and to welcome three new boys: Armando who is 8 years old, Carlos who is 7, and 6-year old Cristopher (all pictured above).

EDUCATION

- We had a year of graduations with three boys graduating from high school, three from middle school, and four from primary school. More than the act of graduating, we rejoice in the Lord for allowing our boys to grow.
- Our six homeschool boys completed many hands-on science experiments and supplemental projects this past year. These boys love the small classroom experience!

RECREATION

- We had another beautiful summer vacation in Bahia de Los Angeles, where we spent quality time together catching over 40 fish and frying them for dinner, digging for clams, and kayaking alongside sea turtles!
- Our garden and orchard has been blessed with an abundance of crops. The boys have successfully cultivated the soil which has resulted in hundreds of meals of zucchini and Swiss chard for everyone.
- The boys continue to train hard and continually achieve new heights in their varying sports endeavors, whether it be soccer, football, or basketball.

ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

- We have successfully completed 60% of the new state requirements to bring the orphanage into compliance.
 - All employees are now First Aid certified and trained in food-handling and sanitation.
 - Additional fire alarms, emergency alarms and lights, and smoke detectors were installed on the property to improve safety and security.

SPIRITUAL


- The generous donations of a Last Supper icon over the Royal Doors, 12 additional icons of the Apostles, and a processional candle set, have immensely enhanced our chapel and worship.
- Throughout the year the boys participated in classes discussing the challenges of living the Faith in a secular society. The boys even wrote and performed a rap song in Spanish on the importance of chastity.
- Our boys' love for the Faith is contagious! This is seen by our Orthodox community growing through the conversion of several local families, including baptisms, chrismations, and even one quinceañera.

RENOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS

- A new telephone system was installed at the orphanage, which met an ever-growing need for quick and easy communication between staff members, as well as outside callers.
- In order to comply with new state regulations, we made enhancements and upgrades to our on-site utilities: electrical, gas, and plumbing. This also significantly improved their efficiency and safety.
- Improvements to the internet have additionally increased reliability and speed, helping to make our internet connectivity a more useful tool.

Home Building Highlights

- Glory to God for all things! From September 2015 to September 2016, 602 beautiful people volunteered to build homes for families in Mexico and complete projects at St. Innocent Orphanage.
 - Of the 602 volunteers, 83 came during September–May and 519 came during June–September.
 - Our volunteers came from 23 U.S. States and two Canadian Provinces, making up approximately 62 volunteer groups.
- Additionally, 28 volunteer staff spent their summer in Mexico facilitating the Home Building Program.
- In 2016, our staff and volunteers constructed 23 homes for a total of 27,050 individual volunteer hours.
 - The homes that were built served two elderly, 46 adults, and 59 children.
 - During our three Orthodox Basic Training build weeks we were enlightened by speakers Fr. Nicholas Andruchow, Fr. Ted Barbas, Fr. Ted Dorrance, George Hazlaris, Jacob Saylor, and Fr. Luke Veronis.
- We give a heartfelt thanks to Zachariah and Sophia who have served as our Work Trip Coordinators for the past two years. Zachariah's brother, Erik Swanson, has taken over and it is exciting to see the energy and talent he brings to the program.




How Your 2015 Donations Were Put to Work
