THE CHANGE IS COMING

During these springtime months we have witnessed a change. We leave the darkness of the disobedient child who was banished from paradise and become children of light. Here, twenty minutes south of the border the rain has come. Because of the more than 17 inches of precipitation during this rainy season, the hills around the orphanage have turned into a picturesque landscape that you would expect to see in the hills of Ireland, not in the suburbs of Tijuana, Mexico. This annual spring



transformation has been paralleled with the Lenten transformation of the boys, the staff and the missionaries. Miracles are occurring and changes are flourishing. In this brief reflection, I would like to give you a glimpse of God's mysteries working within Project Mexico and the St. Innocent Orphanage.

During Great Lent we prepare to receive the resurrected Christ. At the orphanage we spiritually and physically cleanse ourselves through prayer, fasting, repentance, and struggle. The end result is to grow closer to God and imitate His love. As an active Orthodox community, we challenge one another to embrace this growth, which often comes with significant pain. As an athlete struggles to become stronger in preparation for competition, so the boys are encouraged to abandon the skeletons of their past so they do not make the same mistakes their parents made. Many of the young boys do not have any living relatives so they have truly been orphaned, but some of the boys do have family members still alive, but unfortunately, they are often intertwined in the world of debauchery and crime. Recently we made the tough decision to prohibit one of the children from interacting with one of his few living relatives. This was very difficult for our young boy but obviously his contact with this family member was unhealthy and a very poor influence. The result has been a transformation in the boy becoming more loving, trusting and peaceful. Additionally, his academic performance has improved significantly. Christ's springtime has come and the Lord is working through us all.

God's power to cultivate change is exemplified by the generous interns and staff who serve the boys and facilitate the building of homes. They have left the comforts and the standard of living that so many Americans take for granted. Learning to cope with unreliable infrastructure, systemic corruption, economic instability and social misfortunes, allow these missionaries to put life into perspective and find peace in the storm.

The key element in this process is the central role the Church plays in everything we do. Christ guides our decisions through the Holy Bible, leads us to have hope through intimate prayer, encourages self-control through fasting, and challenges us all to grow by participating in the sacrament of confession. For this reason, people sell their homes and leave their professions to make an impact here through Christ's Church. This was articulated by one of our long-term college-aged missionaries, who said, "Despite all the difficulties, I find living in Mexico easier and more peaceful than the craziness of the United States. The life within the Church here at the orphanage changes us for the better."

May this Lenten and Paschal season be transformational for us all.
